Time Commitment

- One 2-hour meeting per month during the academic year.
- Two 3-hour planning sessions in April/May.
- No scheduled board meetings in July and August.
- Committee leadership and participation with volunteers across Canada

 approximately 8-10
 hours over the academic year.

All meetings are virtual.

Eligibility Criteria

- Individuals who are 18 years or over.
- Affiliated with a post-secondary institution or a child and youth care association or program.
- Ability to serve a term of three years.

Directors serve an initial term of three years and are eligible to apply for a second three-year term. A board director from each geographic region is elected annually.

Applicants must demonstrate an affiliation to a post-secondary institution or a child and youth care association or program.

Accreditation Updates

WOW it is hard to believe we are closing out on another academic year!

A huge *thank you* to all CYC educators for your

endless hours of hard work - planning, teaching, grading and supporting students, and all the "other related duties" you have performed over these past months. Please take some time to celebrate your accomplishments and share your successes.

When you begin to move into the planning stages for the next academic year, I wish to draw your attention to a few things related to CYCEAB:

- If your program is discussing the possibility of accreditation, please reach out and we can set up a time to meet. I can answer any questions you may have about the process, the right time to engage in accreditation, and what resources may assist your team with understanding the various steps. I can even connect you with faculty from other accredited programs who have identified that they would love to speak with interested programs about their own experiences.
- If your program is looking to accreditation farther out than the next year or two, again, please reach out. We can meet to discuss how the accreditation Standards (found at the start of each section of the Self-Study Guide) might apply to any program development you may be exploring. We can discuss challenges you may have, assist with information you can share with your administration about the benefits of accreditation, and troubleshoot any areas you are uncertain about.

- Look for communication to be shared about upcoming webinars and facilitated discussion events organized by CYCEAB for 2025-2026. This past year has been a great example of sessions directly related to CYC post-secondary education such as Artificial Intelligence, supporting international students, trends and current issues in practicum, practicum supervision, ungrading, and student mental health. These topics are directly connected to questions in the Engaging the Evidence listings in the Self-Study Guide. Additionally, if there is a topic you are interested in presenting, a topic you think is relevant that should be presented, or a topic you would like to discuss with other educators, please let CYCEAB know.
- The accreditation documents are reviewed and updated annually. We are winding up the process soon for the edits to the fall 2025 documents. (A huge thank you to reviewers and Recommendation Panel members, recently accredited programs, members of the Practicum and Standards Development and Implementation Committees, and CYCEAB board members for the valuable feedback you have provided!) Any programs applying for accreditation by September 15, 2025, will be able to find these updated 2025 versions on the CYCEAB website by August 15, 2025. A reminder: Programs are to use the versions of the documents that correspond to the year in which they make their application.

This 'Be the Change' project is part of our Advocacy and Children's Rights course.


We are proud to announce that we raised \$2230!

St. Clair College





During the 2024-25 school year, the CYC program at St. Clair College in Windsor, ON started a Jack.org chapter. Jack.org is a charity dedicated to youth mental health. Its mission is to empower young people to support each other and advocate for mental health awareness. Our chapter aims to help support the students of St. Clair College and make them aware of the available resources and support. Several of our second-year CYC students planned and implemented an event during the exam week at St. Clair to help support students through this stressful time. Our second-year class wrote notes of encouragement and support, and then the notes were handed out during exam week along with healthy snacks to St. Clair students.

One of our student ambassadors described the event: "Our team handed out notes to passing by students and offered advice and kind words to those who were struggling. We got great feedback from the student body."

Seneca Polytechnic

Seneca Polytechnic recently hosted the 3rd Annual York Region Anti-Human Trafficking Conference 'Knowledge is Power: Educate to Eradicate.' The conference was an opportunity for parents, caregivers, and youth to learn and gain valuable knowledge, tools, and resources. Parents and caregivers learned how to safeguard their children from human trafficking, while connecting with community members to further protect and empower their communities.

The conference provided parents, caregivers, and youth an opportunity to talk directly with 20 plus community members including Victims Services of York Region, Cedar Centre, York Children's Aid, York Regional Police, York Region District School Board, Crime Stoppers, York Region Transit, and 360Kids, among others.

The adult sessions included hearing stories and information from the mother of a survivor, valuable information from the York Region Police, and an opportunity to ask question to an expert panel on the topic of human trafficking.

The youth moved through four different sessions focused on developmentally appropriate topics related to healthy relationships, and keeping themselves safe. The youth workshops were led by BridgeNorth, One Child, York Regional Police, and Dnaagdawenmaga Binnoojiiyag Child and Family Services.

Education Day — Ontario Association of Child and Youth Care Provincial Conference

The Ontario Association of Child and Youth Care held the 2025 provincial conference June 11 to 14. The theme for the conference was 'Constructing Communities of Practice' which was a focal point for Education Day, facilitated virtually by the CYCEAB. Educators, students, and dedicated professionals in the field from across the province gathered to connect, foster community, and share experiences and practices.

Dr. Wolfgang Vachon, professor at Humber Polytechnic in Toronto and CYCEAB Education Committee member, facilitated the lively conversations during Education Day along with conference organizers and faculty from Sheridan College's CYC program, who hosted the conference.

Topics of discussion included the ethical use of Generative AI (such as ChatGPT), ways to amplify and maintain the CYC practitioner identity in the field, supporting students with complex health needs and maintaining accountability to the profession, the impact of the Post-Graduate Work Permit to post-secondary institutions in Ontario, and the comparison of program length (three-year programs, accelerated programs, and two-year/four-semester programs).

Educators shared updates from their respective programs regarding the quickly changing landscape for Ontario colleges and universities. Enrollment numbers, staffing changes at program and institution levels, and reflections on the future hopes for CYC education in Ontario and nationally.

Participants held rich discussions, and there was a strong sense of passion and connection among everyone attending!


